Currently 96 with 8 flights of 12, we could go to 90 entrants with 6 flights of 15 players or 72 with 6 flights of 15. 6 flights would be easier on a budget than 8. No additional comments.

I will now start negotiating with Member Clubs to host our events in 2018. A request has been made to the Calgary Elks to host the Calgary Ladies Amateur and I am awaiting confirmation.

Tournament and Events Reports Barb Alexander, Amateur Chair

Report: The 87th Annual Calgary Ladies Amateur Golf Tournament was held at The Glencoe Golf & Country Club on June 21st, 22nd, and 23rd. The tournament was held

on the Lakes / Slopes rotation. Ninety-five players entered, however, 3 had to withdraw before play started and one player was disqualified after day one, so 91 players completed all 3 days. We had 8 flights with 10-12 players in each flight. Practice rounds were available to all players at a cost of \$57 + GST. The entry fee for the tournament was \$170 + GST.

We had groups of 3 playing a crossover starting at 8:00 day one and three and 9:00 on day two. All 3 days play took 5 hours to complete. Day 1 and 2 the tee times were 8 minutes apart. Delays were causing backups on a couple of holes so day 3 we changed to 8 minutes alternating with 9 minute tee times. This did not change the total time of 5 hours for the rounds, but it did flow better.

Glencoe member Andrea Kosa was the tournament champion with scores of 73-73-75 over the 3 days. Runner up was Meaghan Leblanc from Bearspaw and overall low net was Gaylene Donald from Silver Springs G&CC. All results are available on the website. The weather cooperated all 3 days with warm sunny conditions. The first tee gift was the Beads of Courage and was well received by participants. A buffet lunch was available after play on day 1 and 2 for all players. Extra tickets were sold for \$20 for caddies / guests. Snacks were offered on the 1st and 10th tees all 3 days. The closing banquet was held right after play finished and again extra tickets were available at a cost of \$40. Complimentary prosecco was served behind the 18th green as the leaders were coming in

My sincere thanks go out to my entire committee who made the event run so smoothly and made my job so much easier. Head Professional Judy Forshner as well as the entire pro shop staff and outdoor services crew are to be thanked as well for all of their help and support. Kudos go to Kerry Watkins, Shawn Major and the entire maintenance crew for the excellent course conditions. Finally, thanks to all the volunteers who made everyone's job much easier.

Cindy Beaudet, Riley's Match Play

Report:

This years 32nd Rileys Best ball ladies classic opened the web site and started taking entries

March 1st 2016. We had representation from most clubs.

It was another great year for the best ball, all matches completed in the allotted time allowed no extensions were needed and weather was great right up until championship Sunday which started out a little suspect but ended under sunny warm skies.

For those clubs that are unaware what the Rileys best ball is here is a brief description. 2-person team must be from the same home club. We take the highest index player and reduce by 50%, and then we add the lowest index player together, which gives us a combined total index. Then we flight the teams in groups of 16 teams, lowest to highest. So for the past 5 years the highest combined index accepted were combined 16 the lowest ranked team was +0.1 index. Typically, if you have a combined index of 15 or lower you will qualify for the tournament.

The entry cost is \$100.00 per team that includes a cocktail party hosted by our sponsor Rileys at he Calgary golf & country club as the event kick off. Championship Sunday is hosted by Canyon Meadows with another reception for food and prizes. Both events were tremendous. Unfortunately, with tough economic times our budgets were reduced by 40% from our sponsor. We were able to sustain both events by dipping into our small surplus.

The tournament continues to be the kick off to the tournament season. Winning any flight is a huge accomplishment. It is just as hard to get out of the 2nd flight, as it is the championship flight.

The Rileys best ball is hosted on a reciprocal basis with the home team course waiving any green fees. I would hope that we are able to continue on this model. The Rileys best ball is the largest and longest running best ball tournament in North America.

Lastly, Daniela Cote my co chair has resigned her position and I would like to thank her for all her past work and working on the draw until wee hours of the morning to make it work.

I look forward to another great year in 2017 with lots of great matches and many new friends being made throughout the season.

Report:

The 2016 CHAMPS season is over and we all look forward to next year. Although there were some games cancelled or rescheduled due to inclimate weather, the majority were played (sometimes through adverse conditions) and the winners were: A section with a total of 247 points, Country Hills and the B section with a total of 245 points, also Country Hills. Congratulations ladies.

The windup was held at Silver Springs Golf Club on September 15 with 123 ladies attending. It was a beautiful warm day with great food and wonderful participation. There were some issues arising this year which will be dealt with at the AGM to be held at the Glencoe Golf and Country Club on October 3rd at 6:45 p.m. In brief, the most important issue was pace of play with ladies not wanting to pick up their ball when out of the hole. Another issue in the Rules and Regulations which I would like to change if agreeable, is the matter of ladies travelling to another course (sometimes 70 or more kilometers) only to find that it has snowed and there will be no game that day. I will suggest at the meeting that if inclimate weather is in the forecast, the respective Champs reps PHONE each other either the night before or at least by 6:30 the morning of to reschedule or just cancel and split the points. I anticipate no arguments to this change. One other issue that will be addressed is the A players must play with A players and B players must play with B players. One occurrence this year had an A player playing with a B player and a B player playing with A player in one particular game. This should not happen and will be discussed.

Also Champs reps should be confirming with their respective pro shops and confirming the times early in the year. Dates can be changed, but times should be confirmed at the start of the year so people can finalize their own schedules.

We had one other issue this year in that at one course, some of the ladies were reluctant to play CHAMPS because of the name. I suggested that the ladies should check out the website, read the history of CHAMPS, and focus on the word "hospitality".

Lastly, it was brought up at the spring meeting that perhaps the number of games played should be decreased from 12 to 8. From comments received during the season, it was unanimous that this should not happen and therefore will be mentioned at the fall AGM but obviously not something the clubs want implemented.

6. Old Business

- 1. Changes in the 2016 executive: Daniela Cote resigned as Co-Chair of Riley's. The executive thanks Daniela for her hard work and dedication to Riley's.
- 2. Parameters of commitment for clubs hosting event : With challenging economy we are in dire straights of getting a host club for the Amateur for 2018. This also affects the Executive as the host club comprises seats on the Executive. Pleading to clubs to host and fill the VP role for 2017. Debbie will be reviewing the roster again to look to clubs who haven't hosted. The tournament is hosted only once very 15 years. Encourage clubs who haven't stepped up to come forward. Joanne S. Thanks Debbie for all her hard work.

7. New Business

- 1. Junior Development Coordinator: need to grow the junior girls and need a role to aid in this goal. Shannon Lefroy has volunteered to take on this position. We welcome her.
- 2. New Website: Monika is working on the new website and it will be revealed in due course. As Monika works incredibly hard, the Executive approved an honorarium.
- 3. Vote on a By-law amendment: Cara presented the matter and the background. Discussion occurred. Elbow Springs noted that they only pay for their lady league members not general lady members of the club. Concerns about the April 30th date being too early and would prefer May 15th. Support for April 30th based on early payment with such events like Riley's that start early. ***Request came to cc to the club lady presidents regarding assessments. *** Thought that \$75 isn't enough. Felt that this is a starting point. Concern that we need to standardize this fee. Question presented whether CLGA clubs can be notified if their club has been in arrears. Next year, Sylvie will take on ensuring the assessments are sent to GMs and corresponding Presidents. Can potentially post on the website too.

Motion:

2.5. Any Member Club wishing to withdraw from membership may do so upon notice in writing to the Executive through the Secretary. If any Member Club is in arrears for fees or assessments by April 30th of that current year, a penalty fee of \$75 will be imposed. Payment of the the assessment and penalty fee must be paid no later than May 31st of the current year failing which the Member Club will be automatically suspended. Reinstatement will not occur in the current year or in any subsequent year, until all outstanding fees including penalties are paid. In favour: majority.

- 4. Participation in CLGA events re: Semi Private and Public golf course members. Joanne explained the background for this and the need to address ladies who are not members of a member club but are part of the ladies league and want to participate. Joanne puts it to the President's to contemplate this and to have a non-member sign up for events. Clubs have "non-member league members". Feeling it deters ladies from being members of clubs. There are city courses where people can register with to be eligible to pay CLGA fees and play CLGA events. Question about what would happen for events like Closed ones.
- 5. Women's Day of Golf. Bernie Gristwood, Lynx Ridge, came up and spoke about this event. Inaugural one June 6th. Only a few clubs participated. June 6th, 2017 from 4-8pm. Want to celebrate women who play and new women to play. Bring women friends, colleagues,. Run the event as you choose for 9 holes and then wine, networking, pro shop sales, etc... and spread the word. Recommend having a speaker college player or someone in golf to talk about the event and golf. All about bringing new women to the game. Information sheet passed out to the attendees. This is an international event and hopes all clubs will participate.
